# St. Mary's Catholic School PRE-SCHOOL I PROGRAM

**CHRISTIAN FORMATION:** The purpose of pre-school religious education is to introduce children to God's love by relating it to their limited and very egocentric life experience. St. Mary's Catholic School encourages children to learn and use Christian values: sharing, loving, helping, caring and praying together. The children in Preschool I are learning to honor God by praying each day and by taking part in special liturgies throughout the year.

**LANGUAGE ARTS:** The curriculum helps the child to transfer thoughts into words by providing opportunities in the following: labeling, combining words, describing, opposites, position words, and songs. Language arts curriculum also includes learning about self, the five senses and logical thinking, using pictures, story comprehension, relationships and deductive/inductive reasoning.

**MATHEMATICS, SCIENCE, SOCIAL STUDIES:** Many opportunities are made available through motivating materials for the child to explore, investigate, and discover Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies. This curriculum includes recognizing colors and shapes, counting, classifying, patterning, and comparison activities. Tools from a variety of learning strategies are implemented, including Montessori activities, puzzles, online games.

**GROSS MOTOR SKILLS:** Hand-eye coordination as well as body coordination and balance are developed through various activities emphasizing large muscles. Included in these activities are: block play, climbing, jumping, running, and dance.

**FINE MOTOR SKILLS:** Finger strength and dexterity are developed through gluing, using scissors, playdough, etc. Activities for small muscles are developed through: stringing beads, pegboards, screws and bolts, puzzles, coloring, painting, and tracing.

**SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT:** St. Mary's feels it is most important at this age to learn sharing, group play, and routine in an environment that encourages independence and self-confidence through positive reinforcement and love. This curriculum provides opportunities to interact with the parish and local community through field trips and school activities.
